

QUALIFICATIONS

1. Live in government quarters on Beale AFB.
2. 18 years of age.
3. Affiliated must have a current State of California License spouse of military member or retired military.
3. Able to speak read and write English.
4. Must have a high school diploma or equivalent.
5. Physically and mentally capable of providing care.
6. Willing to go through initial training, ongoing training and training modules.
7. Able to obtain the required insurance coverage.
8. Willing to agree in writing to the requirements for family child care providers.

FCC reduces the cost for individuals to be providers...

FCC providers receive free specialized training, first-aid and CPR certification. The program lends providers important child safety items, a wide range of developmentally appropriate educational materials and supplies for infants through school-aged children. WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE A LICENSED FAMILY CHILD CARE PROVIDER?

Once you are a licensed provider, you are fulfilling a very important mission as a member of the Air Force Child Care Professional Program. You will be expected to maintain the high standards that you have been taught. You will be required to continue your training and Family Child Care providers are inspected monthly to ensure compliance. By meeting these standards and by being a FCC provider you are giving the Beale Community a high quality Child Care alternative to the CDC and YC. Your parents can attend the Parent Advisory Board Meeting and will be invited to be part of the annual multi-disciplinary inspection team.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE AN AFFILIATED CHILD CARE PROVIDER?

Off-base providers that are in compliance with the Air Force Family Child Care Standards and voluntarily submit to the same screening, training, and inspection requirements as on-base licensed providers. Affiliated providers have the same opportunities for training, use of the lending program, etc. Affiliated providers must be spouses of active duty or retired military member. They must be willing to provide child care for at least one child of an active duty member or DoD civilian on base. They must also be licensed by the State of California.

DO YOU WANT TO BE A FAMILY CHILD CARE PROVIDER?

Yes, there is a need at Beale AFB for Family Child Care Providers!

- Infant care
- Care for children of shift/mid-shift workers
- Care for children who like small group settings
- Care for TDY personnel
- Care for children with (this may include asthma, cerebral palsy, physical impairments, ADHD, ADD and Autism).

ADVANTAGES TO BEING A FAMILY CHILD CARE PROVIDER

- Work in your own home.
- Your children can be a part of your child care.
- Set own hours.
- You are the boss of your own business.
- The training you receive can help your own parenting skills and is recognized by Air Force Child Care Professionals if you decide to work in a different type of child care or school-age program.
- You can participate in the FCC USDA Food Program.

FAMILY CHILD CARE :

An Alternative to having a boss.....

Be your own boss, supplement income for home.

On-base and affiliated spouse have the opportunity to be small business owners and set their own hours caring for children at home.

Many base children are cared for each week by licensed military spouses committed to meeting the Wing's mission

Here's how it works:

1. Complete AF Form 1928 and the FCC application including paperwork for background checks.
2. Attend FCC orientation training.
3. Obtain a medical certificate.
4. Complete Community First-aid and CPR.
5. Set up appointment with FCC office to have home inspections for Fire, Safety, Military Public Health, and Family Child Care.
6. Obtain required liability and auto insurance.
7. Await notification from FCC coordinator of results of the FCC panel who reviews and selects the best qualified to become providers and forwards recommendation to the Mission Support Group Commander

It is illegal to provide more than 10 hours of child care per week in base housing without a license from the MSG
